What's different about this year?

This year because of COVID-19 we are running MinneHack online. We will have a Twitch stream running throughout the event for kickoff and announcements as well as a chat service for announcements and other communication between participants, sponsors, and event staff. Judges and Mentors will have to be set up in our chat service to coordinate matching, and can use a video chat service of their choosing or we can set up a Zoom meeting for them. Your Organization's information will also be made available on our website on the sponsors page. Hacking will be from Noon Sat to Noon Sun, judging will be from 1-4ish on Sunday, and prizes will be awarded at 5-5:30.

What is MinneHack?

MinneHack is a hackathon—a software and/or hardware development competition—run by the UMN student chapter of the ACM. MinneHack is an usually in-person but **ONLINE THIS YEAR** hackathon taking place at the University of Minnesota in Coffman Memorial Student Union in which groups of up to 4 students hack together a solution in just a few hours.

At MinneHack 2020 we had over 310 hackers from over 100 schools across the country. All hackers are students or recent students. MinneHack has quickly grown in the last few years to the largest (public) hackathon in the state!

MinneHack 2021 starts on Jan 23, 2021 and ends on Jan 24, 2021 at. Keep in mind that the deadline for all of the information is Jan 19, one week before the event.

Why Sponsor?

How do Mentoring, Judging, and Booths work?

Mentors

The main purpose of mentors is to help the hackers learn. Mentoring is also a good way to get to know the hackers personally and see how they solve problems. We offer some number of mentor positions to each tiered during each mentoring period. This means that your company can send as many different people as you want, but may have no more than your tier's number of mentors at a time. The first mentor shift will be on Sat 23 from 1 PM until 5 PM, and the second mentor shift will be on Sat 23 from 5 PM until 9 PM. Mentors *must* have programming experience. These shifts are merely a suggestion and you can choose to have your mentors available whenever you want between noon and noon.

Judges

We have a great team for MinneHack, but we can't judge all the projects by ourselves. That's where you come in! Your sponsorship tier determines how many judges you can have. Judges get to see the in-depth demos of hackers' projects and ask them questions. After the demos are over each judge assigned to that group will give them a rating on a few different factors. Judging takes place on Jan 24, 2021 between 1 and 5 PM.

Booths

Unfortunately we are not doing booths this year since we don't have a physical space.
